Camberwell Girls Uniform

The Camberwell Girls Grammar School uniform is a visible symbol of our school community and values. It reflects our long history, our present identity and our aspirations for the future. Our uniform philosophy extends across both academic and sports uniforms – each valued equally – and supports students in dressing for comfort, professionalism and pride.

The Camberwell Girls school uniform plays a crucial role in fostering a positive learning environment. It ensures that students comply with essential occupational health and safety standards, while also

teaching them the importance of maintaining professional attire in a workplace setting.

In respecting the Camberwell Girls Uniform Guidelines students should be mindful that their attire and behaviour while in school uniform is reflective of the School and its values. We also acknowledge the importance of support from parents and guardians and ask that families carefully read the guidelines in this document ensuring students have access to the compulsory uniform items which are listed.

Trans-seasonal

Camberwell Girls adopts a trans-seasonal approach to our academic uniforms.

A trans-seasonal uniform means that students can choose to wear the winter or summer uniform on any given day. It is important to note that students are not able to combine different seasonal uniform pieces. This approach allows students to dress according to weather conditions and provides greater choice in catering to individual student needs. It also promotes flexibility, comfort, and student agency, while maintaining the School's expectations around neat, professional dress.

On special events or occasions, students may be required to wear either the full winter academic uniform or the full summer academic uniform. This will be communicated prior to the event.

General Guidelines and Expectations

Students are required to adhere to the following expectations, whether at school or in the community.

All Students

- ◆ Uniforms need to be clean and in good condition.
- ◆ Uniforms should be clearly marked with the student's name.
- ◆ The short and long-sleeved shirt can be worn tucked in or out.
- ◆ All students may wear the short-sleeved shirt with shorts or pants throughout the year.
- ◆ Trousers should break on the shoe and should not be rolled or cuffed.
- ◆ Skirts and summer dresses should extend to just above the knee.
- ◆ Summer dress belts at the back of the dress cannot be altered or tied.
- ◆ Plain white crew socks must be worn with the dress and academic shorts.
- ◆ Navy tights (70+ denier or greater) must be worn with the skirt.
- ◆ Black/navy socks must be worn with the pants.
- ◆ Plain black school shoes must be well-maintained and worn with all academic uniform items. They must be lace-up, leather, and hard-soled. The Mary Jane style shoe is only permitted in the Junior School.
- ◆ Black sneakers, T-bar sandals, platform or patent leather shoes are not permitted.
- ◆ Scarves must be navy blue and are not to be worn during PE, Sport, Science activities or other instances where they may present an occupational health and safety hazard.
- ◆ The navy polar fleece vest may be worn year-round with both the academic and sports uniform, including when travelling to and from school under the blazer. It is not a substitute for the School blazer and must not be worn at formal events.
- ◆ Additional layers may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth; however, these undergarments should be completely hidden.

Specific Year Levels

- ◆ ELC children can choose to wear any combination of the ELC uniform items.
- ◆ In Junior School, the House Bucket Hat must be worn at recess and lunchtimes in Terms 1 and 4.

- ◆ From 2027, the Senior School cornflower blue jumper will be compulsory for all Years 10-12 students and will replace the navy school jumper.

Hair

- ◆ Hair colour should be natural in colour and appearance, and any highlights should be subtle/fine and well maintained.
- ◆ Hair, if longer than the collar, should be completely tied up and back neatly off the shoulders with subtle coloured hair bands.
- ◆ Bows, ribbons, scrunchies, clips or headbands should be navy, black or white and should be small and subtle.

Jewellery

- ◆ Students are permitted up to two ear piercings in each ear. These must be plain studs (less than 4mm) or thin sleepers (up to 10mm). Drop earrings are not permitted.
- ◆ With the exception of watches and appropriate religious/cultural jewellery, items of jewellery are not to be worn.
- ◆ Religious or cultural jewellery must be approved by the relevant Head of School.
- ◆ Cultural and Religious necklaces must be worn long and under the uniform.
- ◆ Makeup and nail polish are not to be worn.
- ◆ Acrylic nails and fake eyelashes are not to be worn.

Badges

Students can wear any badge on their blazer that has been given by the School, awarded by the School or made at the School in a school program/initiative or event. For example:

- ◆ House and Co-Curricular Badges.
- ◆ Commemorative Badges e.g. CGGS 100 years.
- ◆ Badges given as part of School tours or excursions or specific initiative e.g. NASA Space Camp or Duke of Edinburgh Award.
- ◆ Badges made in the MakerSpace e.g. pronoun badges, or CGGS MakerSpace badge.
- ◆ School Celebrating Diversity Badges.
- ◆ Ribbons for International Women's Week, Pride Day, National Reconciliation Week.



Sports Uniform

All students

- ◆ Students may wear the CGGS long-sleeve sports top (no jumpers or hoodies) underneath the School sports polo and House polo top. No other colours or markings are permitted.
- ◆ Specialist sports uniform items and shoes may only be worn during the relevant specialist sport training or match.
- ◆ Sports shoes are to be general-purpose lace up and thick-soled, provide sufficient support, shock absorption and tread. Street or leisure shoes are not acceptable.
- ◆ With the exception of the navy polar fleece vest, sports uniform items cannot be worn in combination with the academic uniform.

Specific to Junior School

- ◆ Students in Foundation to Year 6 may wear the sports uniform all day on Interschool Sports training/competition days, when they have a timetabled PE lesson, or an approved co-curricular sports activity on that day.
- ◆ At Junior School, students with a scheduled sport activity before school, at lunch or after school may wear their sport uniform all day, provided prior approval has been given by the classroom teacher or Head of Junior School.
- ◆ Scarves are not to be worn with the sports uniform.

Specific to Secondary School Levels

- ◆ If students only have sport or a physical activity before or after school (e.g. Saturday Netball training without a PE class), they must change into their academic uniform for the school day.
- ◆ Students in Years 7 to 12 may wear the sports uniform all day on their GSV Sport match and training day and when they have a PE lesson, or an approved Drama/Dance timetabled lesson as communicated by the Head of Department.
- ◆ Scarves must be navy blue and are not to be worn during PE, Sport, Science or other instances where they may present an occupational health and safety hazard.

Travelling to and from School

- ◆ Students must wear the correct School uniform (academic or sport) when travelling to and from School.
- ◆ Students must only use the School bag and these must be stored securely in the student's locker during the School day and are not to be worn around campus or to and from classes.

Co-Curricular Uniforms

- ◆ Co-Curricular uniform items (e.g. Snowsports, Tour Jumpers, Production/Musical T-shirts) are not to be worn unless participating in the specific co-curricular activity.

Casual Clothes

- ◆ Students must comply with essential occupational health and safety standards (closed toed shoes, long hair tied back where relevant, sun smart) and maintain professional attire when wearing casual clothes.
- ◆ Clothing must be respectful and appropriate for the lessons and activities scheduled during the day.
- ◆ Sports uniform rules still apply.

Uniform Pass

Circumstances may sometimes prevent a student from meeting the uniform expectations and guidelines outlined in this document.

In such cases, students in the Secondary School must speak with their Year Level Coordinator or the relevant Head of School to obtain a Uniform Pass as soon as possible. The Uniform Pass provides official permission to be out of uniform for a specific reason and period of time. Students should carry the pass at all times.

In the Junior School, Uniform Passes are not used. Instead, the Head of Junior School works directly with families to provide individual support where needed.

In all cases, it is expected that students will return to full school uniform as soon as reasonably possible.

Second Hand Uniforms

The Parents and Friends Association (PFA) coordinates the Second Hand Uniform Service, which volunteers manage.

The dates Second Hand Uniform Service is open will be published on the school calendar.

Uniforms can be dropped off throughout the school year at Junior or Secondary School Reception, or the Secondary School Student Services desk. The Consignment Form (available at reception) must be completed when uniforms are dropped off.

Consignment items:

- ◆ Only the following uniform items will be accepted for resale by consignment:
 - ◆ Blazers
 - ◆ Soft Shell Jackets
 - ◆ Tunics
 - ◆ Winter Skirts
- ◆ Proceeds are shared between the parent (credited to their School Fee (Parent) Account) and the PFA
- ◆ The Parent must remain a current parent of the School for 12 months after lodging consignment items to receive credit.
- ◆ Items must sell within 12 months of lodgement; otherwise, they will be treated as donations.

Donated items:

- ◆ All current uniform items not eligible for consignment are accepted as donations. Proceeds from the sale of donated items go in full to the PFA.
- ◆ Socks, school bags, caps, hats, bathers, and shoes are welcomed as donations but are not accepted for resale.
- ◆ Wearable items no longer meeting school standards are donated through the Katalyst Foundation, and non-wearable textiles are sustainably recycled via Upparel.
- ◆ Items that cannot be reused are sent to Upparel for shredding and recycling, helping us reduce textile waste sustainably.
